Dr. van Hardenbroek was Dutch and finished her medical training in the early 1950s. She took on medical work in Libya and lived there with her young family. She then moved to the United States and lived and worked most of that time in Colorado, though she had plans to return to a Third World country. She owned a small (two-bed) hospital that served the local skiing community. She was very active in environmental health issues.
